

Samantha Anne, MD, MS, is a Professor in the Cleveland Clinic Head and Neck Institute and serves as Medical Director of Pediatric Ear and Hearing Disorders. She earned her Bachelor of Science, Master of Science, and Doctor of Medicine degrees from Wayne State University. Her postgraduate training included a two-year otolaryngology residency at the State University of New York, followed by completion of residency training at University Hospitals and Case Western Reserve University. She subsequently completed a fellowship in pediatric otolaryngology at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Anne's clinical expertise encompasses the full spectrum of pediatric hearing disorders, with particular emphasis on complex cases. Her areas of specialization include cochlear implantation, cholesteatoma, chronic ear disease and infections, aural atresia, and endoscopic ear surgery. Her research focuses on pediatric hearing loss and outcomes associated with cochlear implantation in children.

Dr. Anne has authored more than 120 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters and has published a book on pediatric hearing loss. In recognition of her expertise, she is frequently invited to speak at national and international venues.
