

Dr. Esther X. Vivas is Professor of Otolaryngology–Head and Neck Surgery at Emory University School of Medicine, where she serves as Chief of the Division of Otology–Neurotology, Director of the Otology Fellowship, and Director of the Temporal Bone Surgical Dissection Laboratory. She completed her residency at Albert Einstein College of Medicine, where she was Administrative Chief Resident, followed by a fellowship in Neurotology and Skull Base Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center. She has directed Emory's 5 day temporal bone course since 2015. Her clinical and research expertise centers on cochlear implantation in older adults as well as the otologic manifestations of idiopathic intracranial hypertension. She has authored numerous peer-reviewed publications and sits on editorial boards. Dr. Vivas has held leadership positions with the American Academy of Otolaryngology–Head and Neck Surgery, the American Neurotology Society, The North American SkullBase Society, the American Cochlear Implant Alliance and the Pan-American Society of Otolaryngology. She is a frequent invited lecturer and course faculty for temporal bone dissection, cochlear implantation, and skull base surgery worldwide. Her expertise has also been recognized beyond the academic community, with her work cited in The New York Times, the Atlanta Journal-Constitution, and Travel + Leisure
