

Todd A. Hillman, MD, is a board-certified otologist and neurotologist with extensive clinical, academic, and research experience in disorders of the ear, lateral skull base, hearing, and balance. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from The Ohio State University, graduating *magna cum laude*, and earned his Doctor of Medicine from The Ohio State University College of Medicine. He completed residency training in Otolaryngology–Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Utah, followed by fellowship training in Neuro-Otology at Pittsburgh Ear Associates.

Dr. Hillman is certified by the American Board of Otolaryngology and holds a Certificate of Added Qualification in Otology/Neurotology. He is currently a partner at Pittsburgh Ear Associates and serves as Co-Director of the Allegheny General Hospital Balance Center. His prior academic appointments include Assistant Professor of Otolaryngology at the University of Utah School of Medicine and Adjunct Assistant Professor in the Department of Bioengineering.

An accomplished clinician-scientist, Dr. Hillman has served as principal investigator or co-investigator on multiple funded research projects supported by the National Institutes of Health, industry partners, and private foundations. His scholarly work includes numerous peer-reviewed publications, book chapters, and invited presentations, with research interests spanning skull base surgery, cochlear implantation, vestibular disorders, hearing preservation, and implantable auditory technologies.

Dr. Hillman is a Fellow of the American Neurotology Society and an active member of multiple professional organizations. He has received numerous teaching and professional honors, including the Leland P. Johnson Teacher of the Year Award and repeated recognition as one of Pittsburgh Magazine’s “Best Doctors.”
